Federal Mandates as Required by 2-1-407, MCA

This summary report is provided in accordance with Title 2, Chapter 1, part 4, MCA, which requires that state programs meet the requirements of federal statutes in good faith and with a critical view toward any federal regulations, guidelines, or policies, with due consideration of the financial restraints of local governments, the citizens of Montana, and the state, including the limitation imposed by Article III, Section 9 of the Montana Constitution.

This report requires by Title 2, Chapter 1, part 407, MCA, each state agency implementing federal mandates to provide information regarding the cost of federal mandates. The table 1 identifies some of the most costly and burdensome federal mandates to the State of Montana as identified for the 2015 biennium of which there were five notable mandates submitted by agencies for \$89.7 million, approximately seventy-six percent of the total annual costs of federal mandates to the agencies. Table 2 provides a list of all identified mandates submitted by state agencies. The total cost identified by state agencies is approximately \$117.7 million per year. Other federal mandates for which the cost estimates are unknown due to lack of research resources and other factors are also listed.
